Poster (EX0846, EX0852, EX0859)

A poster is a good way to communicate complex material and knowledge in a more easy to understand way, and offers a short cut into your work and results. Make it inviting to read and look at!

To make a poster is a mandatory part of the Master Project course. The poster should summarize the results of the master project. The motive for doing a poster is for the student to train the ability to make a popular scientific summary. Of importance is that the poster communicates clearly and understandably to the viewer.

It is not mandatory to follow the template for SLU Thesis Day. View the template as a guide on how to compress your message. The important thing is that the poster communicates to the viewer. You can find the general instructions from SLU Thesis Day at the Student Web. These instructions you may look at if you like. The SLU Thesis day template is not mandatory to use, you may choose another design.

Some facts:

- It is important that the poster communicates to the viewer
- The size of the poster should be preferably A1 or A2 (or the size recommended by SLU Thesis Day), but not A3 (too small).
- Use Power Point (or another program), and convert it to a printable pdf.

Hand in the poster as a pdf to marie.larsson@slu.se, at the latest on the day for presentation/examination. Hang a printed poster in the corridor outside Studio, on the day of presentation/examination.
